Dear Customer,

This letter is a response to your enquiry about year 2000 support in Quite Software Ltd. products. We are pleased to inform you that all of our products were written in full knowledge of the year 2000 issues, and should not be affected by the change-over from the year 1999 to 2000.

Our products, when fully licensed, do not perform any form of date-based calculation and with the exceptions noted below do not store or manipulate dates.

Use of dates by Quite Imposing and Quite Imposing Plus

Quite Imposing and Quite Imposing Plus store a date into a PDF file whenever an imposition is performed. This uses a four-digit year format and is therefore COMPLIANT.

Quite Imposing Plus will display the dates when an imposition was performed. This uses a four-digit year format and is therefore COMPLIANT.

Dates contained on a page of a PDF file are maintained as a sequence of digits and are unaffected by any processing performed by Quite Imposing or Quite Imposing Plus.

Use of dates by PSAlter

PSAlter displays dates when it generates a report. Dates are displayed according to the user's preferences, which may be for 2-digit or 4-digit date. No further calculations are made on displayed dates, so this is therefore COMPLIANT.

Dates contained on a page of a PostScript file are maintained as a sequence of digits and are unaffected by any processing performed by PSAlter.



Use of dates by Quite A Box Of Tricks

Quite A Box Of Tricks does not perform any date-specific processing and is therefore COMPLIANT.

Dates contained on a page of a PDF file are maintained as a sequence of digits and are unaffected by any processing performed by Quite A Box Of Tricks.

Dependencies

All of our products are dependent upon the date services provided by the operating system and hardware, and on the reliable operation of the same after the year 2000. You are advised to obtain a statement from Apple or Microsoft, according to your operating system, and from the manufacturer of your computer hardware.

In addition, Quite A Box Of Tricks, Quite Imposing and Quite Imposing Plus are plug-ins to Adobe Acrobat Exchange and therefore rely on the services of Acrobat Exchange. Adobe have issued a year 2000 compliance statement indicating that the current versions of their Acrobat product line (as at February 1, 1997 and thereafter), are COMPLIANT. You are advised to obtain and verify a copy of said statement.
